LETTER FROM PASTOR

Lead Pastor Newsletter Article February 2023

Remember when we would go to a store and actual try on an item before purchasing. Modern marketers are now calling this call this an "inconvenience," but I never viewed it as such. While trying on shoes or clothes meant leaving the comfort of our homes, doing so gave us the chance to see if we liked the look or feel of a product BEFORE we took it home. What is more, there was no risk in doing so! The worst thing that could happen was that we simply tried something else or left empty-handed.

Several years ago, I attended a conference where the leaders challenged the attendees to "try on" new ideas. They stated that, just as with clothes or shoes, we could always walk away if these concepts didn't fit. I love that perspective! Doesn't it seem far less scary to engage in things that are new if we view them as simply "trying something on" to "see if it fits"?

As many of know, Team Network has been studying Tod Bolsinger's book "Canoeing in the Mountains," which challenges churches to adapt to the "new world" where we find ourselves. This perspective offers a possible need for change and/in how we do things. Bolsinger encourages churches to experiment and see what works, and to do so without fear of failure. This sounds a lot like the "old fashioned" "try on" doesn't it?

I was so excited when Team Network decided to give this perspective a shot this Lenten Season by intentionally leading events which are intended to be outside our "norm." Will they work? We just don't know, but I think a lot of the successes or failures depends on us. Which brings me to the question "Will we take the time to 'try on' the events and give them our "all?" Before you answer let me give you an overview of what is happening: Let me offer you an overview of what this Lenten season will offer:

- 1. Wednesday, February 22 at 6:30 p.m. --- The Youth are planning an Ash Wednesday Service. This will give us an amazing start to the season of Lent with our youth leading the way into a season of repentance. How will their "take" on the service challenge us?
- 2. Friday, March 3rd from 7-9 --- There will be an opportunity to be a part of an inter-generational learning experience. This will be facilitated by Louise Bergman. We will watch two episodes of the movie/or/show called "The Chosen." This show, which enacts scenes from Jesus' life, and does a great job of inviting dialogue about the life and teachings of Jesus in a way that can be understood by all ages. What a great chance for us to learn and grow together. Also, this could be a great outreach tool for any friends or family who are interested in Jesus, but not real excited about the church!

- 3. Friday, March 10 (time TBD) ---March Madness/Chili-Cook off Fundraiser (at FBC)---What better than a night of fun and fellowship that serves a cause! The Senior High Sunday School class has joined up with the Stewardship and Finance Team to raise funds for Shelterhouse (more information to follow). Whether you want to show off your best chili or just come try someone else's chili while watching the game, this event is sure to fit the bill. Due to the fundraising aspect of this event, it will be advertised widely in the community!
- 4. Saturday, March 18 (time TBD)---You have heard of Christmas Caroling, well we are going to try EASTER Caroling? Come join us for an evening of spreading the message of God's love through song to those who are unable to participate in the life of the church on a regular basis. Want to be included or know someone who should be? Please contact Bunny Mitchell (Congregational Care) or Janice Wallace (Missions).
- 5. Friday, March 24 from 3-6pm--- Let's get out in the community with a fellowship gathering at Cultivate, a free coffee and tea shop in the mall, called "Books and Bakes." This outreach event will invite members of our community to come and enjoy a warm beverage and sweet treat while getting crafty making book marks OR exchanging their much-loved books with other readers. - 6. Monday, March 27 at 5:30 p.m. --- Join us for a Family Fellowship Meal at the church hosted by Barb Neil and Linda Atiemo-Obeng. While this is another great chance for fellowship, let's make it more! Let's make this a true Lenten a challenge for us to invite a friend who doesn't attend church, or is simply a non-believer. This invitation is to build relationships only, so there will be NO ALTER CALLS, only a meal with new friends.
- 7. Finally, our Lenten "experiments"/ "try ons" will end on Thursday, April 6 at 6:30 p.m. with a Maundy Thursday Service, where once again is planned and led by the youth. This special day has so much potential to be a powerful experience in the life of a believer! I look forward in anticipation with our youth leading us through a meaningful experience.

As you can see there are many opportunities to "try on" and I'm excited to see what God has in store for us with these events. Who knows what ideas will inspire new avenues for our congregation. I do hope you'll take advantage of some, or all of these gatherings.

TECHNOLOGY UPDATE

We wanted to bring to your attention, in case you are unaware, some of the technology difficulties FBC has been experiencing in various areas that affect Worship Service, Praise Team, and Audio-Visual Team tasks.

In December, Microsoft Windows pushed out an update that caused the laptop used for Worship Service to crash and burn. (Many people experienced this problem.) Even after reloading Windows 10 and other programs, Shelley Page was unable to get the laptop to communicate with other devices and was forced to send the laptop out to be "fixed" by better computer technology experts than herself. In the meantime, FBC experienced difficulties during Worship Service using another laptop that is not considered a media machine and does not have our normal Worship Service program loaded for slides, videos, etc.

In January, our Worship Service laptop was returned in good working order, but just as FBC was returning to normal broadcasting, the projector used in the Sanctuary began experiencing difficulties...first we experienced problems with the lamp, which our Maintenance Manager replaced, then we experienced problems getting the projector to accept the new lamp and to reset the counter. As such, we keep getting an error telling us the bulb needs replaced, or the machine overheats. Then, the projector refused to display anything. After many, many hours of troubleshooting by our Office Manager, Maintenance Manager and Rev. Aleka Schmidt...and even an attempt to use a temporary portable projector...we were finally able to get the old projector working again. We do not know if errors will continue to pop-up.

Then the software program used during service (ProPresenter) required an update to a new version by January 31. The new version was more than a normal upgrade; it came in a format very different to what we had before and has a HUGE learning curve. This program refused to respond last Sunday to our normal method of controlling the slides during Worship Service.

In addition to these technological problems, we've tried to introduce an update for our Worship Services...a monitor for pastor and Praise Team to use. (The television was a gift from members of the church.) Again, due to technological problems, the television was experiencing loss of connectivity to the laptop via WiFi.

Part of the problems we are experiencing in Worship is due to the age of our equipment and that most of our technological devices are analog equipment that we are attempting to interface with newer digital devices, requiring special converters or adapters in order to work. (Using old technology with new technology has its own set of challenges.) Please have patience with us as we attempt to improve FBC's worship experience both in-house and online.
