### LETTER FROM PASTOR

#### **Lead Pastor Newsletter Article March 2023**

Many of us remember a time when businesses were closed on Sunday mornings and schools wouldn't dare schedule an event on a Wednesday night (because those were Church days). But these days it isn't unheard of for a soccer or hockey tournament to take place on a Sunday morning or (as we experienced) schools to plan musical performances for a religious holiday like Ash Wednesday. Our world certainly has changed.

This societal or cultural transformation, whether we like it or not, means that we need to adapt if we are going to be relevant in today's world. This doesn't mean getting rid of the core elements of who we are, the embodiment of God's kingdom in the world, but it DOES mean taking a closer look at HOW we, here at FBC, embody God's kingdom. It means asking "How are we supposed to be the Church in today's world?"

While in the past the Church has looked to "experts" to answer this question, in our current situation these people simply don't exist! Every Church is in the same boat of knowing there is no clear path forward. Every Church is seeking answers.

As the leadership has begun to consider what this will mean for FBC, we have been challenged to consider that in order for you (the congregation) to be comfortable following us in uncharted territory, we have to prove that we are trust worthy. After all, there is risk in going toward an unknown change which may mean a loss of some sort, even if that loss leads to something good.

To ease the discomfort, which usually accompanies change, leadership must realize that they need to stay connected to the congregation. To listen and remain in relationship, during this journey into the unknown, is necessary. Staying connected, our leadership looks to the uncharted territory of this new world where we must face these changes and adapt.


But adaptation is not scrapping everything. It is vital that we not lose who FBC is at our core (our DNA). We must ask what we need to preserve to remain the church we know and love, while also considering what it is that we CAN disregard and what it is that we need to create to be the Church that God is calling us to be in this new day.

I know, as a member, you may fear not know what is going on as these changes are happening. That is why it will be important for us to communicate well, not just through words but (as leaders) to embody the changes we hope will happen. May Team Network not just talk about being more connected, but may we ACTUALLY be connected to other members; to listen to their thoughts about what they are experiencing.

Our intention is to try out new ways of being FBC in these coming days and months; knowing that some of these experiments will be fruitful, while others may simply help us to learn. The point will be to learn and to listen in everything we do, to as many people as possible with the goal of hearing and discerning ways FBC can adapt to this new world. Who knows what we will learn?

Team Network's goal in this season of our life together is to give some of what we have been learning from Canoeing in the Mountains, which I have summarized above, a try. My hope, as your pastor, is that you each will take part and share your feedback in what happens over these coming months. Bolsinger is clear that change requires that we ALL take part. Join us as we look ahead to the journey that God has for FBC.

On **May 21, during the 10am worship service** at First Baptist, we will present a story that includes key moments in the life of Moses, from his birth to the parting of the Red Sea (based in Exodus 2,3, 7-10, and 14-15). Our musical includes a few songs from the 1998 Dreamworks animated film "The Prince of Egypt", as well as some Sunday school favorites and Hebrew folk music. Main characters in order of appearance are:

PRINCESS Pharoah's Daughter, rescues baby Moses from the river,

speaking part & ensemble singing

MIRIAM Moses' Sister, interacts with Princess, speaking part & sings a solo

MOSES Man of God, deliverer of the Hebrew people, speaking & singing parts

HASHEM Disembodied voice of God,

may read spoken lines (instead of memorizing), ensemble singing & possible solo

VARIOUS EGYPTIAN GUARDS, MIDIANITES, AND HEBREW PEOPLE

brief speaking parts & ensemble singing
