LETTER FROM PASTOR

Lead Pastor Newsletter Article October 2023

Last winter my daughter Lola was cast in the musical "A Christmas Story." At the end of the two-week run cast, crew, and parents were asked to participate in "striking the set" (taking apart the scenery, putting away costumes, etc.). At first, it felt strange to go behind the scenes. The strangeness came from feeling as though I was seeing something I wasn't supposed to. However, after a few minutes I found myself with a deeper appreciation for how what I had witnessed had all come together.

Today I want to give you a "behind the scenes" look at what Church Council is doing so that perhaps, would be much like my own experience at the Center for the Arts. I share this so you can have a deeper appreciation for the work you are witnessing. The Church Council has worked hard over these last few years to move away from being a group where information is simply shared with the team that is truly seeking to lead the Church into the future. So, what does that future of FBC look like? Well, come with me and find out!

In September, the Church Council had a half-day retreat where we set forth some goals for this coming year. During that time, we considered FBC's "What We Do" statement; asking how we could be more intentional about "living the life that Jesus would live," to truly be a Church where (as our Who We Are Statement says) "every person matters and relationships with God and neighbors grow."

Of the five areas mentioned in the statement:

- · meaningful worship and study
- · valuing, and loving others through service
- embracing God' created diversity.
- · intentional connections with our community
- caring for one another through all of life

We discerned three which would receive our focus this coming year:

- · meaningful worship and study
- · intentional connections with our community
- caring for one another through all of life.

As an attainable goal for meaningful worship and study, we decided we would establish a formalized worship ministry. If you recall, this was part of our recent by-law update, but there had been no further movement in the area. I am happy to say that as of today, Bobbie Baker has agreed to take the chair position of that ministry and will begin meeting regularly with Pastor Aleka and myself to determine next steps for this ministry. Next, as an attainable goal for making intentional connections with our community, Church Council felt the church should prioritize ministry to/with HeadStart, the government funded pre-school which uses our building during the week. HeadStart is a program geared towards low-income families, the very community which the Scriptures declares we are to provide and care for. While we have had some connections with the school and its leadership, this seemed like a great place for us to make deeper connections, which may make a huge difference. As of now, there has been a fund created to help with needs which arise at the school, and Felicity Dowker and I intend to meet with Vicki Rutledge, the school administrator, next month to discuss other opportunities.

Finally, the Church Council discerned that we needed to make a consorted effort to provide long-term and short-term care for the needs of the congregation so that we can truly "care for one another through all of life." Progress on this goal is already underway as a small group has formed around the topic of grieving the loss of a spouse. This opportunity was created after there was a need felt for it by both members as well as the leaders of the congregation.

The Church Council was very excited to learn during our October meeting that progress is already being made towards these goals! My hope is that you will take the time to share with leadership how this all sounds to you as we will be hosting a Sunday School hour "Special Event" on Sunday, October 22nd. Please make plans to come and share your thoughts and feedback about these goals, as well as ask any questions you may have or share your ideas! I look forward to seeing you then.
